


Professional LLM in International Business Law

Program Description

This one-year, full-time specialization is designed to give lawyers and professionals from around the world advanced training in international business law.

This specialization's core courses give you knowledge in critical areas of international business law, while the specialization's large number of elective courses allow the opportunity to pursue your other academic interests.

Who Should Apply for This Program?

Law graduates, with at least two years' legal practice experience, related work experience or a demonstrated interest in international business law.

Specialization Structure

The International Business Law specialization is a 1-year, full-time program. Students can begin the program in the Fall or Winter term. All courses require in-person attendance and are scheduled in a variety of formats (daytime, evening, weekend and intensive) across both Osgoode Hall Law School and OsgoodePD campuses.

Elective courses can be drawn from the Professional LLM in Canadian Common Law, and in some cases from other Professional LLM specializations.

Degree Requirements Overview

To fulfill your degree requirements, you need to complete 36 credits, including a research requirement. These credits must include:

- Introduction to Canadian Law (3 credits) and Legal Research and Writing for International Students (3 credits)
- At least 21 credits from International Business Law courses or related electives
- Research Paper Requirement (choice of the following):
 - Significant Research Paper [30 pages] completed as the means of assessment for one of the courses within the specialization; or
 - Independent Significant Research Paper (3 credits) [30 pages]; or
 - Major Research Paper (6 credits) [70 pages]

Professional LLM in Canadian Common Law

Program Description

The Professional LLM in Canadian Common Law provides the opportunity to take core courses in Canadian common law topics taught at the graduate level along with a wide range of elective options.

The core courses are specifically designed to meet the requirements of the Federation of Law Societies of Canada’s National Committee on Accreditation (NCA). Students in the Canadian Common Law specialization benefit from both academic and career support to assist in their transition to the Canadian legal marketplace.

Note: Completing the Professional LLM in Canadian Common Law does not automatically entitle you to practise law in Canada or to be admitted to the Bar of a Canadian province or territory. Consult the NCA or your provincial/territorial law society for more information.

Who Should Apply for This Program?

Graduates of law degree programs from outside Canada, who wish to become licensed to practise in a Canadian common law jurisdiction, or want a solid grounding in Canadian common law for comparative law purposes.

Specialization Structure

The Canadian Common Law specialization is designed to give students the flexibility to select courses to fulfill their NCA requirements and fit their schedules.

All courses in the Canadian Common Law specialization require in-person attendance and are scheduled in a variety of formats (daytime, evening, weekend and intensive) across both Osgoode Hall Law School and OsgoodePD campuses.





Full-time students typically complete the specialization in one year (12 credits per term over three terms) and part-time students can typically complete the specialization over two years (6 credits per term over six terms). New full-time and part-time students are admitted in the Fall and Winter terms.

Students can complete their degree requirements exclusively through course work or through a combination of course work and a research paper. Elective courses can be drawn from other Professional LLM specializations.

Professional LLM in Taxation Law

Program Description

Knowledge of tax law is essential to any business environment, and the study of this legal specialization is intellectually fascinating.

The Professional LLM in Taxation Law offers students an opportunity to gain a deeper understanding of the policies, principles and the internal logic of tax laws in Canada and internationally. It covers all core tax law and policy concepts, with annual offerings in corporate and international tax. A variety of elective options are offered each year.

Courses are taught by a diverse range of highly qualified scholars and practitioners, all of whom are leaders in their areas of practice.

Who Should Apply for This Program?

Law graduates with at least two years of legal work experience or a strong demonstrated interest in tax law.

On an exceptional basis, recent law degree graduates with a strong academic background and demonstrated interest in tax are admitted.



Specialization Structure

The full-time Taxation Law LLM specialization is designed for full-time students and all courses require in-person attendance.

Completed over one full year of study, full-time Taxation students complete their degree requirements through a combination of LLM course offerings. Courses take place at both Osgoode Hall Law School and OsgoodePD campuses to provide students an opportunity to participate in campus life.

The specialization accepts new students every Fall. Students can complete their degree requirements exclusively through course work or through a combination of course work and a Major Research Paper. Full-time students are strongly encouraged to consider completing a Major Research Paper.

Degree Requirements Overview

To fulfill your degree requirements, you need to complete 36 credits, including a research requirement. These credits must include:

- Tax Policy, Statutory Interpretation and the Foundations of the Taxation of Individuals (6 Credits)
- At least 30 credits from Taxation Law courses

 - Independent Significant Research Paper [3 credits] (30 pages); or

Lawyers or law graduates with legal work experience who have knowledge and expertise in two or more areas of specialization.

The Professional LLM in General Law provides an option for lawyers to combine two or three specializations to customize their learning.

Full-time students typically complete the specialization in one year (12 credits per term over three terms) and part-time students can typically complete the specialization over two years (6 credits per term over six terms). New full-time and part-time students are admitted in the Fall and Winter terms.

Students can complete their degree requirements exclusively through course work or through a combination of course work and a research paper. Elective courses can be drawn from other Professional LLM specializations.

Graduate Diploma in Foundations of Canadian Law

Program Description

The Graduate Diploma in Foundations of Canadian Law is designed to provide students with a foundational understanding of the Canadian legal system. The program focuses on the key areas of public and private law while providing students a unique opportunity to specialize in their academic interests through elective courses.

Courses are taught by a diverse range of highly qualified scholars and practitioners, all of whom are leaders in their areas of practice.

Who Should Apply for This Program?

Graduates of law degree programs from civil law jurisdictions outside Canada who need to build a strong foundation in common law before pursuing accreditation to practise in Canada.

Internationally trained law graduates looking for academic and career training and support.

Program Structure

The full-time diploma will be delivered in seminar-style classes, in which students will participate in person. Classes are scheduled in a variety of formats (daytime, evening, weekend and intensive) across both Osgoode Hall Law School and OsgoodePD campuses.

The diploma program accepts new students every Winter. Elective courses can be drawn from Professional LLM specializations.

Diploma Requirements Overview

To fulfill your diploma requirements, you need to complete 18 credits. These credits must include:

- Canadian Legal Research and Analysis (3 credits)
- Academic and Applied Legal Writing (3 credits)

Graduate Degree and Diploma Fees and Admission Requirements

Applying to a Graduate Program at OsgoodePD

Start dates and application deadlines vary by program. Please refer to the individual webpage for current start dates and application deadlines. We recommend that you submit your application well before the deadline, as space is limited and cannot be guaranteed. Graduate program applications are submitted through York University's online application system. Non-degree and preparatory program applications can be done through the International Admissions Office.

Required Application Documents

The application documents listed represent the minimum requirements for graduate degree and diploma programs – submitting these documents does not guarantee admission.

- **Official transcripts from all post-secondary institutions**
- **Current Resume / CV**
- **Two References**
- **Writing Sample**
- **Proof of English Language Proficiency (if applicable)**
Applicants who are granted a conditional offer must submit their test results within the following timeline:
 - Fall Start Program – no later than July 30
 - Winter Start Program – no later than November 1

Academic Requirements

Admissions to LLM specializations at OsgoodePD are competitive. The OsgoodePD Admissions Committee reviews each applicant's file taking into consideration an individual's academic background, professional work experience and fit for the program. The information detailed on the next page, under Academic Background, represents the minimum admissions requirements for graduate degree programs – meeting these criteria does not guarantee admission.

If English is not your first language, you must supply proof of language proficiency. You may be exempted from this requirement if you have completed **at least one year** of full-time study at an accredited university where English is the **only** official language of instruction.



Admission Requirements

The information detailed below represents the minimum admissions requirements for graduate degree and diploma programs – meeting these criteria does not guarantee admission:

Language Proficiency Requirements

If your first language is not English, you must show you have an acceptable level of English by completing a language proficiency test.

If you have completed at least ONE year of full time study at an accredited university where English is the ONLY official language of instruction at the institution level (not only the program level), you will not be required to provide a language test:

Online NCA Exam Prep

OsgoodePD offers the only online NCA preparatory program for internationally trained lawyers and law graduates who are planning to write the National Committee on Accreditation's examinations.

Program Structure

This course has been designed by experienced NCA instructors specifically for the online environment. The material is comprehensive but concise and modules are separated into manageable amounts.

You have the flexibility to work through courses either intensively or over a few months, depending entirely on your schedule. Modules are mapped to the NCA syllabi to maximize reading efficiency and material comprehension. 
