This program can be completed exclusively through online learning. This option is available for part-time study only. Full-Time students are required to attend classes in-person.

- Translate your legal knowledge to the Canadian system

If you're a civil law trained lawyer, you can:

- Complete most, if not all, of your required NCA subjects
- Learn foundational common-law concepts and skills you need to prepare for practice in Canada
- Access information about and support for the licensing process and Canadian legal market

Program Format

The LLM in Canadian Common Law requires completion of 36 credits obtained through coursework or a combination of coursework and a research paper. Courses are offered in a combination of weekly and intensive formats.

You won't have to commit to a thesis, but your progress and performance will be evaluated through short papers, presentations, and exams.

Full-Time Studies | Attend courses in-person over one year (three terms).

Part-Time Studies | Complete the program over two years (six terms) and have the option to take courses either in-person or online through live video conferencing (see course schedules for details).

Note: Completing the Professional LLM in Canadian Common Law does not automatically entitle you to practise law in Canada or to be admitted to the Bar of a Canadian province or territory. Consult the NCA or your provincial/territorial law society for more information.

Core Courses

Core courses in the Canadian Common Law LLM are specifically designed to meet the requirements of the Federation of Law Societies of Canada's National Committee on Accreditation (NCA). Core courses include:
